

Hunting Club is Granted Charter of Incorporation

ALBANY, July 25.—The Casey Mountain Hunting Club, Inc., a newly formed membership corporation, was granted a charter here yesterday by Secretary of State Edward J. Flynn. The purpose of the corporation is to prevent illegal killing of fish and game, to promote propagation of fish and game and to protect and observe laws relative to hunting and fishing.

Henry Crannell of 14 Fifth street, Glens Falls, is the president of the organization, whose principal office will be located at Glens Falls, Warren county. It includes territory in Warren, Hamilton and Essex counties.

The camp is located on Casey Mountain, north of North River on the top of North Hill. It includes 10 to 15 acres at present. The club has the right to sell, hold, buy, mortgage or lease real and personal property for the purpose of operation.

William M. Cameron of 150 Glen street, Glens Falls, is the attorney for the club and filed the articles of incorporation, which were granted a charter here.
