P.S. In locating an area for impounding the minnows for propagation in their screened area, I might suggest the shallows in the bay on the east end of the bridge --where formerly there was a low archway where the boats went through to the other side of the lake and which was closed up when the new highway road was built. This is the bay between "Folded Wings" and your roadside camp, just off the east end of the present bridge. You might call Mr. Greene's attention to this as it may be suitable for the purpose. If not he will have to find another location.

also for Crown Point Bay in upper end of Lake
