

Water Level Of Lake George Is To Be Studied

LAKE GEORGE—Control of the lake levels and the proposed planting of land-locked salmon will be two of the important projects which will be discussed at the 33rd annual meeting of the Lake George Association tomorrow afternoon at the Sagamore Hotel, Bolton Landing. It has been announced by Col. W. B. Woodbury, president.

Charles Leggett of Glens Falls and Chestertown, representing the Federation of Fish and Game Clubs in this area, will be one of the speakers and will advocate a project to attract more fishermen to the lake.

Charles H. Tuttle of Lake George and New York will also be among the speakers. Officers will be elected and reports submitted by the sanitary inspectors and various committee chairmen.

Mr. Woodbury announced that the chemical survey, a recent report of which indicated that the sanitary inspections by the association for the past 33 years have been highly effective, will be continued. The survey showed that Lake George is an ideal habitat for deep-water fish and prominent anglers, enthused over the results obtained, are determined to support a huge fish planting project.
