# M'Chesney Gives Report On Local Fish and Game

1938

According to the annual report of the Ticonderoga Fish and Game Club, as prepared by President George M'Chesney, the following number and species of fish were planted in the designated lakes, ponds and streams during the year:

Lake George—400 Lake trout, 6 inches; 35,000 Lake trout, 2 inches; 3,000 Lake trout, 4 inches; 9,000 Small Mouth bass.  
Goose Neck Pond—7,000 Lake trout, inches.
