Gentlemen:

Regarding the Application No. S-4-69 of Mr. Harland H. Stubing for a permit to place 150 feet of sand fill along his property extending 15 feet into Eagle Lake, Town of Ticonderoga, County of Essex, New York, The Eagle Lake Property Owners Association at a Special Meeting on July 5, 1969, thirty-two members being present, voted unanimously to oppose the granting of the permit to Mr. Stubing on the following grounds:

1. The map and plans filed by Mr. Stubing with his application for a permit are vague and meaningless because they do not indicate a base point from which measurements can be taken to control the length of fill or the extension into the lake.
2. The type of construction is not detailed and provides no guarantee against erosion and pollution of the waters of the lake.
3. The material to be used states sand fill but contains no analysis as to the silt content or material minus the 200 mesh. Any amount of silt or fine material introduced into the lake could destroy all black bass spawning areas in the area of the fill.
4. The placing of cribbing or riprap on the shores of the lake cannot add to its beauty but will only detract from its natural beauty.

To identify The Eagle Lake Property Owners Association it is a non-profit organization of interested property owners on Eagle Lake. It has been in existence for sixty-one years and at the present time has sixty-two members. The association and its members are dedicated to preserving the natural beauty of the lake and its surrounding area. Protecting the purity of the water in the lake and promoting its natural resources for the

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enjoyment and use of future generations is our main purpose. It is for these reasons that they oppose the granting of the permit and urge you to reject the application.
