Excuse lead pencil as I am in a hurry to get this off. Stan made & forwarded to Hurd & Fitz copies of Flint's letter. The family will absolutely drop the case and there will be no appeal for even that would cause more court expenses plus Flint's charge as I doubt whether his interest in the case extends to his pocket book. Will let you know what is what, as soon as I see Flint. My father is in very bad shape at present, suffering from a decided general breakdown and the doctor doubts ~~his~~ the ability of my father to last till Christmas.
