

SUBJECT: Application of Harland H. Stubing for permit to fill
in waters of Eagle Lake

TO: Members of Eagle Lake Property Owners Association

Mr. Harland H. Stubing has made application to the New York State Conservation Department, Water Resources Commission, State Campus, Albany, N. Y. 12226 for a permit to construct 150 feet of wooden cribbing and place 1000 cubic yards of fill in the waters of Eagle Lake, Town of Ticonderoga, Essex County, N. Y.

The purpose stated in his application is to fill erosion holes, cover junk thrown over the bank and make a permanent wall. The real purpose for the permit is to allow the applicant to enlarge the parking lot of the Eagle Lake Inn or Barroom into the waters of Eagle Lake.

This matter is of vital importance to you and the future of Eagle Lake and its pure water. You are requested to file an objection to the granting of this permit with the New York State Conservation Department.

The following are grounds for your objection. Also in your letter state that you are a property owner on Eagle Lake and a party in interest.

1. The proposed cribbing and additional fill would unduly encroach into the waters of Eagle Lake.
- ✓ 2. The proposed cribbing and additional fill would destroy a portion of a black bass spawning ground.
- ✓ 3. The proposed cribbing and additional fill would further extend the present unauthorized fill previously made by a former owner.
- ✓ 4. The proposed cribbing and additional fill would be unsightly, unnatural and objectionable.
- ✓ 5. The small amount of debris and junk presently at the location of the proposed cribbing and additional fill could be easily removed and should be so removed instead of covered.
- ✓ 6. The real purpose of the application is to enable applicant to extend an already substantial and adequate parking area for a barroom into the waters of Eagle Lake.
7. The proposed increase in the size of the present parking area will increase the number of cars and number of people parking and thereby increase the amount of debris such as beer cans, bottles and cartons thrown into the waters of the lake.
8. The proposal is not in the public interest and is solely for the promotion of the bar business of one private individual.

9. No actual notice of the application has been given to the many non-resident but interested shore owners who would not see the notice published in the Ticonderoga Sentinel.

10. Upon information and belief, the applicant, Harland H. Stubing is not the owner of record of the lands adjacent to the proposed fill and was not the owner of record on January 16, 1969, the date of his application.
